Various items that I have found to be very useful while doing thread wrapping/weaving.

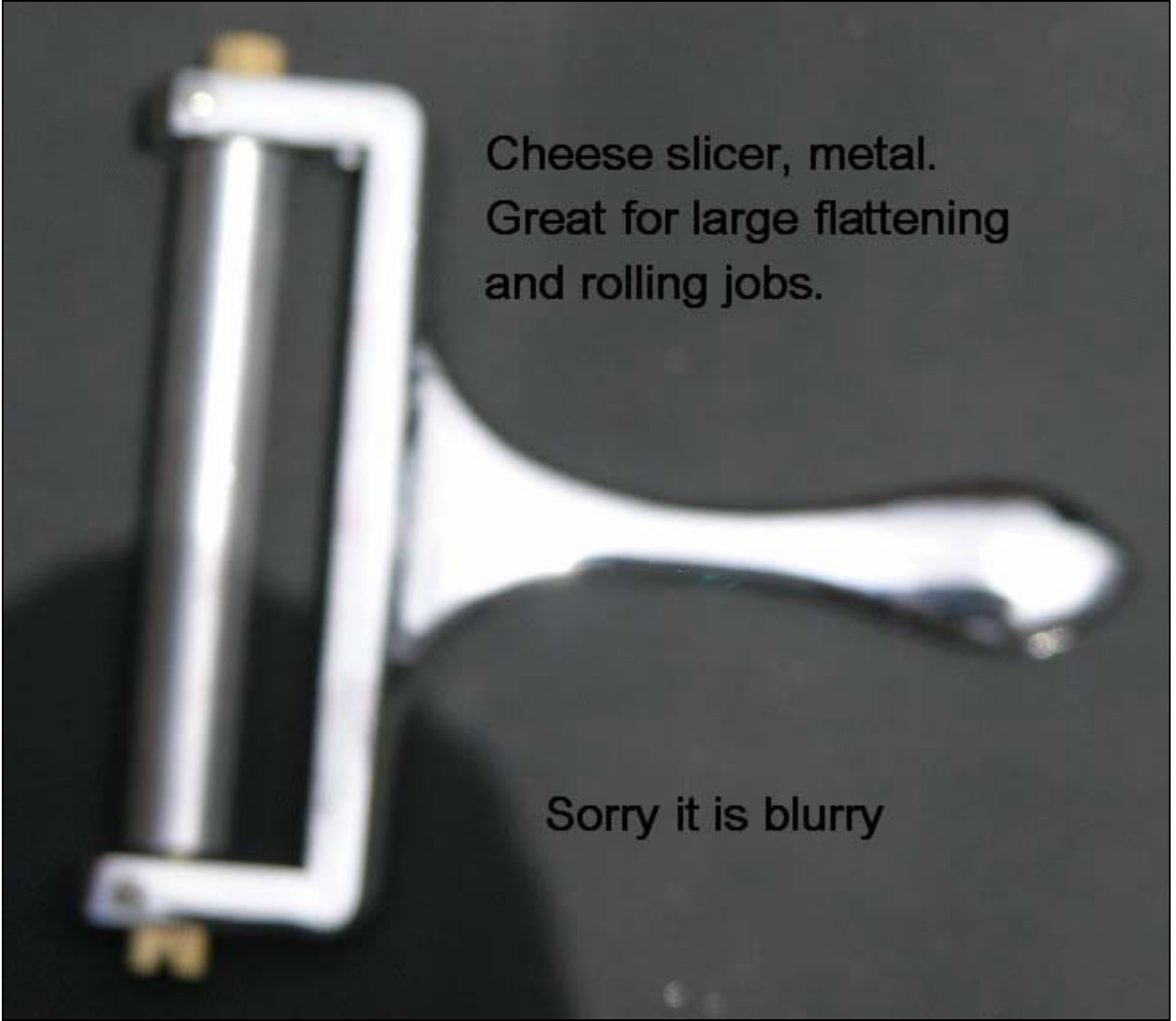
Dental Pick - Used for burnishing, rolling and gentle pushing of thread in crosswraps.

Dental tool - flattened, smoothed and rounded end.
Use flattened end for moving specific threads in weaves and crosswraps and the rounded stem for rolling and flattening threads to close gaps.



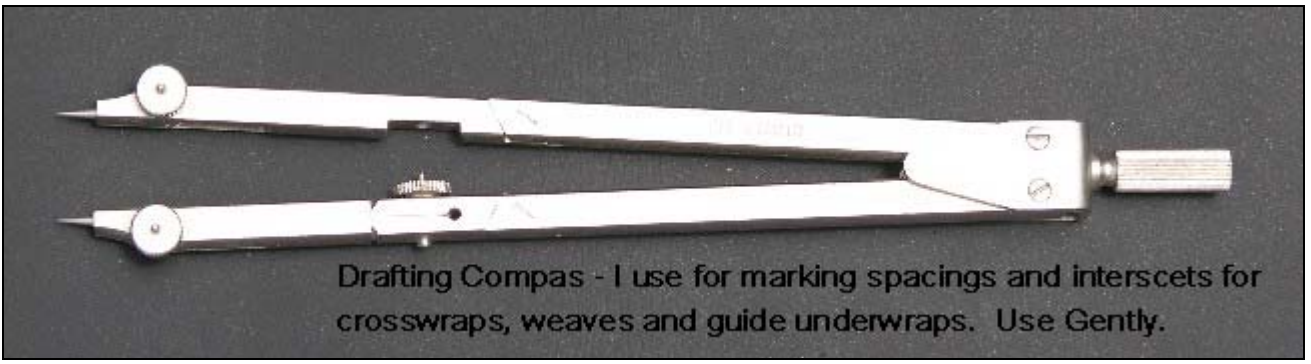
Dental tool pointed and smoothed. Point used for moving specific threads and rounded stem for rolling, burnishing and Flattening.





Cheese slicer, metal.
Great for large flattening
and rolling jobs.

Drafting Compass - I use for marking spacings and interscets for
crosswraps, weaves and guide underwraps. Use Gently.

Eye glass screwdriver, rounded and smoothed. Used for moving threads in weaves and crosswraps. More for spot use on one or two threads at a time.



Flush cut wire cutters. Great for cutting pulled threads on flat wraps. Bring thread to test at the electronics store. Takes the place of razor blades.



Point can be used
for pushing thread
in weaves and
cross wraps

Rounded back can be used to roll thread flat



Flat edge can be used for moving large sections
of thread in crosswraps.

Burnishing tool - Gudebrod I think.

Custom Hand made weaving tool.



Large needle with eye ground
down - for pushing thread into slots.

Sm Crochet needle flattened and
smoothed - for picking up threads in
weaving

Newer 90 degree angles Jigs. Keeps
the thread closer to the rod.



**Pliers(smoothe jawed) - Great
for pulling and tightening
thread**



Spectra 12# Loop. Thread puller.



Spring Scissors. General thread cutting.



Strap used for stabilizing the rod and keeping it from rotating.



Surgical Knife with #11 blade. Great for trimming small bumps and blemishes in finish.



I keep it sharp longer by using fine ceramic stone.
